BACKGROUND

The Measure V Resident's Oversight Committee meets quarterly to review actuals from the prior quarters. The scope of this discussion is "to review the expenditure of the revenue from this transactions and use tax" in accordance with the Committee's scope in Section 6.28.170 of the Tracy Municipal Code (TMC).

DISCUSSION

The City's fiscal year is from July 1 through June 30. The City conducts an annual audit at the close of the fiscal year. Section 6.28.160 of the TMC states "...no later than December 31st of each year, the City's independent auditors shall complete a financial audit report to include the revenue raised and expended by this tax."

# History

2016

City of Tracy enacted a 1/2¢ sales tax for 20 years, providing an estimated \$7 million dollars annually, with citizens' oversight, and all funds spent locally."

2017

Project Priorities: Aquatic Center (\$30m), Legacy Fields (\$10m), Multi-Gen Rec Center (\$40m), Library, and Ritter Family Ballpark.

2018

Allocated \$4m for planning and design Multi-Gen, \$1m design Aquatics Center, and \$1.5m design for Legacy Fields

2019

Established a not-to-exceed budget of \$55M in Measure V funds for the Aquatic Center.

2020

Funding allocations of \$55m for the Aquatics Center, \$40m for the Multi-Gen Center and \$40m for operations and maintenance.

2021

Directed to establish a tax-exempt lease revenue bond for Legacy Fields ≤ \$21m with a 15-year repayment term. Nature Park added to project priorities

2022

Additional commitments of \$1m to the Nature Park design phase, and \$3m to begin the feasibility and design study of Ritter Family Ball Park

2023

Nothing Reported

2024

Annual debt service payment of \$3.1m for a \$54m 30-year bond for Multi-Gen Center, El Pescadero Park improvements and related public improvements.

2025

Aquatic Center moves from Phase 1 Conceptual Design into Phase 2 Detailed Design

## 2016-2024 Annual Comprehensive Financial Reports

### *Measure V Sales Tax Revenues*

The City receives tax proceeds from the Measure V one-half cent sales tax approved by Tracy voters in November 2016, commencing for a twenty year period beginning April 1, 2017. ***The amount of Measure V tax proceeds received and recorded during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 was \$12,110,516.*** Measure V is a general tax of the City and the revenues were deposited in the City's General Fund. Expenditures for a variety of City functions were made from the City's General Fund utilizing the Measure V and other revenue of the City.
