Staff recommends that the City Council conduct a public hearing and during such hearing, (1) receive a report from staff and the City's demographic consultant on the districting process, permissible criteria to be considered to draw City Council Member election district boundaries, and public outreach; (2) provide and receive input from the public on the composition of voting districts; (3) review draft and revised maps prepared by the demographic consultant; (4) review draft maps and plans submitted by members of the public; (5) update maps, if necessary; (6) select a final map; (7) determine the sequence of district elections; and (8) provide direction for the preparation of an ordinance for by-district elections.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At its special Council Meeting on August 26, 2025, the Tracy City Council adopted a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Tracy Declaring Its Intent to Transition from At-Large to By-District Council Member Elections Under Elections Code § 10010. Pursuant to the Elections Code, the City of Tracy has scheduled four public hearings regarding districting. The first hearing was held on October 28, 2025, the second hearing was held on November 18, 2025, and the third hearing was held on December 11, 2025. The fourth Public Hearing will be held on January 13, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. and, during this Public Hearing, staff recommends that the City Council (1) receive a report from staff and the City's demographic consultant on the districting process, permissible criteria to be considered to draw City Council Member election district boundaries, and public outreach; (2) provide and receive input from the public on the composition of voting districts; (3) review draft and revised maps prepared by the demographic consultant; (4) review draft maps and plans submitted by members of the public; (5) update maps, if necessary; (6) select a final map; (7) determine the sequence of district elections; and (8) provide direction for the preparation of an ordinance for by-district elections.

BACKGROUND AND LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

General Background

If the transition from at-large, citywide elections to by-district elections for Council Members is approved, the City anticipates that the November 2026 election of Council Members will be conducted by district, with two (2) district elections taking place in that election, and the final two (2) district elections taking place in November 2028. The Mayor will remain as an at-large, citywide elected position, with the mayoral election occurring every two (2) years. To help facilitate this process, the following consultants have been retained to assist with the potential transition to by-district elections: Wagaman Strategies and Tripepi Smith.

While not explicitly required to do so, staff intends to comply with the public hearing requirements outlined in Elections Code Section 21150. In addition to the Public Hearings on October 28, November 18, and December 11, staff has scheduled a fourth Public Hearing on January 13, 2026, at 7:00 p.m.

Review of Public Hearings To Date

At the Public Hearing on October 28, the City Council received an update on the districting process, including the timeline and public outreach efforts, and the City's demographic consultant, Michael Wagaman, presented information about the districting process, permissible criteria to be considered to draw City Council Member election district boundaries, and mapping tools. City Council Members also requested additional information related to the creation of draft plans at the October 28 Public Hearing.

At the Public Hearing on November 18, the City Council received an update on the districting process, including the timeline and additional public outreach efforts. Michael Wagaman presented information about the districting process and permissible criteria to be considered to draw City Council Member election district boundaries. Additionally, City Council Members provided feedback to Michael Wagaman regarding the composition of draft maps and the deadline for members of the public to submit draft maps and Communities of Interest for consideration at the December 11 Public Hearing (Public Hearing #3). In response to the feedback from City Council Members, the deadline for the public to submit draft maps and Communities of Interest for consideration at the December 11 Public Hearing (Public Hearing #3) was extended to December 1, 2025, at 6:00 p.m.

At the Public Hearing on December 11, the City Council received an update on the districting process, including the timeline and additional public outreach efforts. The City Council also reviewed draft maps and provided additional feedback to Michael Wagaman on the composition of revised draft maps.

In response to the feedback from community members at the December 11 Public Hearing, the deadline for the public to submit draft maps and Communities of Interest was extended to January 2, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. for consideration at the January 13 Public Hearing (Public Hearing #4). Maps and Communities of Interest submitted after 5:00 p.m. on January 2, 2026, will be treated as public comment for the January 13 Public Hearing.

Based on City Council Members' feedback at the December 11 Public Hearing, Michael Wagaman prepared three (3) revised draft maps, outlined in Attachment A to this staff report, for the City Council's review and consideration at the January 13 Public Hearing. The original versions of the revised draft maps are outlined in Attachment B to this staff report. Demographic information for the original and revised draft maps prepared by Michael Wagaman is included in Attachment C to this staff report.

A total of twelve (12) draft maps were timely submitted by members of the public as outlined in Attachment D to this staff report, including nine (9) maps timely submitted before Public Hearing #3 and three (3) maps timely submitted before Public Hearing #4. Demographic information for the draft maps outlined in Attachment D is included in Attachment E to this staff report.

Review Required by Elections Code 21130(b)

Consistent with the City's existing obligations under the federal Voting Rights Act, the City considered whether it was possible to create an election district or districts in which a minority group was sufficiently large and geographically compact to constitute a majority in a single-member district, as set forth in *Thornburg v. Gingles*, 478 U.S. 30 (1986), and as interpreted in case law regarding enforcement of the federal Voting Rights Act with respect to redistricting. During the analysis of draft maps, the City's demographer determined it is possible to draw one district with 50-51% Latino Citizen Voting Age Population (CVAP), as determined by unadjusted data from the 2019-2023 American Community Survey (ACS), in the northeastern portion of the City. However, drawing such a district in that area would subordinate other traditional race-neutral redistricting criteria currently prioritized by public input and Council direction.

January 13, 2026 Public Hearing

At the Public Hearing on January 13, the City Council will receive an update on the districting process, including the timeline and additional public outreach efforts. The City Council will also review revised and original draft maps prepared by Michael Wagaman and draft maps submitted by members of the public. Additionally, staff anticipates that the City Council will update maps, if necessary; select a final map; determine the sequence of district elections; and provide direction for the preparation of an ordinance for by-district elections.

The sequence of district elections refers to the assignment of districts to election cycles, for example two (2) district elections taking place in the November 2026 election and two (2) district elections taking place in the November 2028 election, if the transition from at-large, citywide elections to by-district elections for Council Members is approved.

FISCAL IMPACT

There are no fiscal impacts related to the actions requested of the City Council in this staff report, except for operational expenses, the expenses incurred under the professional services agreements with Wagaman Strategies and Tripepi Smith, English-to-Spanish translation fees for districting materials, and fees incurred for the production and distribution of a utility bill insert. The professional services agreements, translation fees, and utility bill insert fees are within the City Manager's spending authority. This staff report does not include a request for additional funding.

STRATEGIC PLAN

This agenda item supports the City Council's strategic priority of Declaring Its Intent to Transition from At-Large to By-District Council Member Elections Under Elections Code § 10010.

Tracy Unified School District Middle School Boundaries



 - Staff will be available in the lobby outside Council Chambers at least 1 hour before the January 13 Public Hearing to answer questions
 - Districting will be featured in the City Manager's January Newsletter on January 15, 2026
 - Additional notifications will be issued to advise the public of the status of this process and any final outcomes





Criteria

In order of priority:

- Equal Population
- Federal Law
- Contiguous
- Communities of interest
- Topography/Geography
- Compactness



Things to Remember

Strive for population equality. Be prepared to justify deviations

Ensure compliance with federal Voting Rights Act. Avoid vote dilution where required

Do not use race as the predominant factor. Only as one of many factors and cannot subordinate other redistricting criteria

Focus on traditional criteria. Draw contiguous divisions, respecting communities of interest, making use of existing topography and geography, while being compact as possible.

Don't focus on politics. Avoid considering impacts on parties, incumbents, or candidates.
