ADDENDUM No. 3: Questions and Answers during Bidding Phase

Q1: Bid Item # 2 - Will Typical TCPs be acceptable that cover similar types of work and lane closure requirements? Or will specific TCPs be required for all 87 locations?

A: Typical TCPs are acceptable however the City reserves the right to amend in the field as deemed necessary by the Engineer or representative.

Q2: Bid Item # 3 - Section 7.1 says " Contractor to furnish, ATC cabinet, CMU tester, and high-density switch pack tester" . Are the testers to be included in the price for this bid item? If so, does the City require 1 each or 2 each?

A: Yes, testers are included in the price for this bid item. City will require 1 each.

Q3: Bid Item #6 - Does this bid item include furnishing and installing all new backplates or installing yellow tape on existing backplates?

A: Bid item includes furnishing and installing all new backplates, no tape proposed on project.

Q4: Bid Item #9 - Location 21. Eleventh St & Corral Hollow Rd - The existing pole appears to be a Type-1B but previously there was a Type-15TS pole at that location. Was the existing foundation modified to accommodate a 1B pole? Or was a whole new 1B foundation installed at some point? Are we to furnish and install a new Type-1B after repairing the foundation?

A: At the time of AMG's field review, maintenance had replaced the existing Type-15TS pole with a Type-1B pole. Since that field review, maintenance has replaced the Type-1B pole with a Type-15S pole. Therefore, the work associated with Bid Item #9 has already been completed by maintenance, and this bid item may be removed from the plans.

Q5: Is night work acceptable for the backplate replacement/taping portion of the project to minimize traffic impacts?

A: Night work is acceptable; however, it is subject to City approval at least two weeks prior to commencing work at a specific location. The City reserves the right to approve or disapprove of night work based on the location and applicable City noise ordinance requirements. If approved, Contractor must reimburse City for the cost of the overtime inspection or testing.
